### **Alberta Ombudsman 41<sup>st</sup> Annual Report**

*Edmonton...* The 2007/08 Annual Report of the Alberta Ombudsman was submitted to the Legislature today under the authority of Section 28(1) of the *Ombudsman Act*.

The Report contains a summary of the key challenges and accomplishments including:

- a cross section of case summaries where recommendations by the Alberta Ombudsman resulted in improved processes of its jurisdictional authorities;
- the results of a jurisdictional challenge by the Alberta Human Rights and Citizenship Commission;
- a statistical review of the year; and
- an overview of our performance relative to targets in our business plan.

The Alberta Ombudsman is an officer of the Legislative Assembly of Alberta and reports directly to the Legislative Assembly. The Alberta Ombudsman operates independently from any part of the Alberta government and individual elected officials. The authority for the Alberta Ombudsman to investigate complaints is found in the Alberta *Ombudsman Act* and includes the decisions and actions of provincial government departments, agencies, boards, commissions, designated professional organizations and the patient concerns resolution process of Health Authorities.
